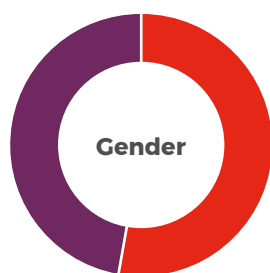
Creating work connections and supporting people to live their dreams.

We helped **job seekers / tāngata whai mahi to find work** and we also helped people to **stay in work**.

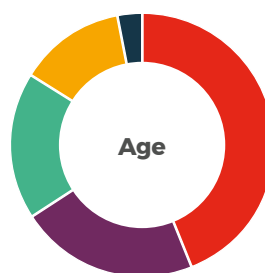
Of the **2,279 people** in total we worked with during the year...
